No sacrifice needed

FamilyVoice Australia has criticised a Hobart City Council decision to help pay for a "sordid art installation" that is to feature a dead sacrificial British corpse.

"There is no justification to use taxpayer dollars to pay for a sordid art installation featuring the body of a deceased person," said FamilyVoice spokesman David d'Lima.

"Hopefully no-one will agree to donate their remains for such a purpose, and surely no sacrifice is needed," he said.

FamilyVoice is keen for reconciliation between Indigenous and non-Indigenous Australians, according to David d'Lima.

"We want reconciliation but cannot see how the blame and shame mentality that would require human sacrifice can possibly achieve unity and peace," he said.

"Hobart City Council should use its limited funds to encourage the advancement of all of its ratepayers and not fund one man's highly questionable racially-inspired arty politico ambition."
