Sport and Politics Do Mix: Zed Seselja loses out as ACT Senator

The defeat of Zed Seselja by senator-elect and former sporting star David Pocock in the ACT has clearly exemplified what the 'cost' is in trying to appease the 'political left' by a conservative candidate – voter rejection.

"FamilyVoice has repeatedly urged Liberal Party parliamentary representatives in the ACT to expound their family-oriented views to the 'true conservative believers' without success with 'no thanks' to the Liberal Party who have opted instead for left-leaning campaigns in so-called progressive-leaning Canberra," said Greg Bondar, FamilyVoice spokesman.
