Sanctity of Life	★ No party position in support of abortion★ Allows MPs a conscience vote	 ★ Supports free abortions ★ Undetailed 'party decision' to revise 2019 policy that compelled public hospitals to perform abortions via federal funding
Gender on Government IDs	★ Supports retaining gender on birth certificates and other government ID documents	★ Supportive of removing gender from birth certificates and other government ID documents, according to the Yogyakarta Principles
Transgender Operations	★ No policy to force taxpayers to publicly fund "sex-change" operations	★ Will require taxpayers to publicly fund "sex-change" operations
Gender Ideology	★ Cut all Federal funding to Safe Schools and other fluid-gender ideology programs in schools	★ Supports Federal funding for Safe Schools and other fluid-gender ideology programs in schools
National Chaplaincy program	★ Introduced and continues to support the National Chaplaincy program	★ Will downgrade program, allowing diversion of funding into "secular" welfare officers, and will require undisclosed "ongoing qualifications"
Parental Rights to Faith-Based Schooling	★ Pushed to restrict ability of faith- based schools to determine student enrolment policies	★ Pushed for restrictions on enrolment and employment policies, constraining ability of faith-based schools to operate in accordance with their ethos
Religious Freedom	★ Will introduce a Freedom of Religion Commissioner	★ Will introduce a Commissioner for Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity and Intersex Status issues
Freedom of Speech	★ No policy to criminalise subjectively offensive words except for racial discrimination	★ Will severely restrict freedom of speech around "LGBTIQ" issues
