FamilyVoice Australia Convenes Faith Leaders' Summit After Religious Discrimination Bill Hiatus

The government has shelved its promise to overhaul religious freedom laws leaving yet another Coalition promise unfulfilled from its 2019 election commitments.

"Mr Morrison failed to learn from Abraham Lincoln's June 16, 1858 speech in which he said that "a house divided against itself, cannot stand" thereby leaving some 14 million voting Christians in Australia without protection against persecution and litigation should they declare their faith at work, school or in the public arena," said Greg Bondar, FamilyVoice spokesman.

I predicated last week in Spectator Australia that the RDB would never see the light of day and now it's certainly unlikely that the Coalition is all but guaranteed not to bring it back for debate when the Senate next sits in March.

"In response to the failure of the Morrison government to live up to its commitment to have a religious discrimination bill before the next election, FamilyVoice Australia will urgently convene a meeting of Christian Faith Leaders with a view to picking up the pieces after the government's dismal failure to deliver," added Greg Bondar.

Christians live in a hostile environment in Australia which will now become even more hostile after much gloating by a handful of recalcitrant Coalition members and anti-Christian LGBTIAQ+ left activists.

"We have a sex discrimination, age discrimination, and disability discrimination legislation but we are denied religious discrimination legislation all because of the false rhetoric and pharisaic grandstanding by Christian hating minorities," concluded Greg Bondar.

The faith leaders' summit will be held within the next weeks.
