End puberty blocking intervention

Advocacy group FamilyVoice Australia is urging the federal government to coordinate a prohibition on the use of puberty blockers, after Britain's National Health Service banned their prescription this week.

FamilyVoice gender spokesman David d'Lima said the federal government should follow the UK example and ban puberty blocking prescriptions.

"Prime Minister Albanese must take action against the disastrous harm resulting from prescribing drugs that prevent the onset of puberty among gender-confused young people," David d'Lima said.

"Counselling, and simply allowing young people to grow up normally, are the best responses to sexual confusion that sometimes occurs during adolescence.

"But huge increases in the demand for radical gender intervention will continue if we persist with a chemically-based attempted solution to issues of identity confusion."

FamilyVoice Australia has also criticised promotions of the 'queer agenda' in the media, by schools, and through legislative changes that include anti-discrimination legislation.

"It's time to push back on cultural changes, fuelled by medical intervention, that have led to massive increases of gender confusion that simply did not exist until recently," David d'Lima said.
