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Gender intervention shaky foundations

Australian governments must recognise a UK finding that gender intervention is based on shaky foundations, and should stop harming children through puberty-blocking, according to FamilyVoice Australia spokesman David d’Lima.

“A report from Britain’s National Health Service has found there is no good evidence to support the prescription of hormones to children aimed at blocking puberty or to transition to the opposite gender,” David d’Lima said.

“According to Dr Hilary Cass in her report as chair of the NHS review, radical gender intervention is built on shaky foundations.

“Australian governments must recognise that finding and withdraw tax-payer funding for young people’s gender intervention.”

FamilyVoice Australia is disappointed that politicians in Australian jurisdictions persistently refuse to investigate radical gender intervention among young people.

“Governments at the very least should hold full independent enquiries into the impact of puberty blocking and gender transition among young people.”
