Sex ed bungle warrants legal action

FamilyVoice Australia fully supports legal action against South Australia's Education Department after year nine girls in a sexual education class learned about bestiality from a guest speaker with no teacher present and no parental consent, in Renmark last year.

FamilyVoice spokesman David d'Lima said the Department of Education is at fault because it undermines the role of parents to educate their children concerning sexuality.

"It's appalling that any school would overlook parental consent and allow an unsupervised guest speaker to provide graphic details about bestiality," David d'Lima said.

"The school is apologetic, but legal action is warranted to ensure a restoration of parental rights and a much more serious approach to the duty of care.

"Schools operate in the place of parents, who must reclaim their role to ensure the safe education of their children.

"FamilyVoice fully supports legal action to ensure the Department is brought to account."
